

Mandatory Professional Licensure Disclosure
SUNY Cortland
Program: Therapeutic Recreation

New York State prides itself in the high quality of its licensed and certified professionals. For the protection of its citizens, each license and certificate has requirements that individuals must meet to be licensed or certified in New York State. SUNY's academic programs leading to licensure or certification are carefully designed to meet and exceed these State requirements. This is a role SUNY plays in protecting the public. Other states frequently have their own requirements, so if your goal is to practice in another state, this disclosure will help you check to see what that state requires.

Per U.S. Federal Regulations, §668.14 and §668.43, and in compliance with the State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements ([SARA Policy Manual](#)), SUNY Cortland provides the following disclosure related to the educational requirements for professional licensure and certification.¹

This Disclosure is strictly limited to the SUNY Cortland's determination of its BS in Recreation with a Concentration in Therapeutic Recreation, MS in Recreation with a Therapeutic Recreation, and a CAS in Therapeutic Recreation,

Upon successful completion of the program and passing the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification Exam, students are eligible to apply for the national Certified Therapeutic Recreation Therapist Specialist recognized in New York State.

The program does not meet eligibility standards for state level licensure or certification in any other US state or territory.
