

Attention International Students: Join us for a trip to the Rosamond Gifford Zoo in Syracuse, NY on Saturday, April 23. The bus will leave Corey Union at 12:30pm and West Campus at approximately 12:40pm and we'll depart the zoo at approximately 4:15pm. The cost for the trip is \$3. Sign up on Cortland Connect and stop by the office to pay the registration fee. The deadline to sign up is Tuesday April 19. According to their website, "The zoo is home to more than 700 animals representing 216 different species -- from tiny poison dart frogs to 8,000-pound Asian elephants -many of them threatened or endangered. The zoo actively collaborates with its non-profit partner, Friends of the Zoo, to provide visitors with experiences that excite, memories that endure and knowledge that inspires global wildlife conservation."

Intern with an International Organization in NYC through New Paltz's Global Engagement Program!

Over the past several years, SUNY Cortland students have enjoyed participating in the semester-long <u>Global Engagement Program (GEP) in New York City</u>. SUNY New Paltz, which runs the program, is <u>currently accepting applications</u> through April 22. The GEP provides a fully integrated learning experience that includes:

- · internship in which students work 20-25 hours per week at a relevant international organization (6-9 credits)
- weekly seminar on international affairs that integrates the students' internship work experience (3 credits)
- · research colloquium through which students conduct an original study related to their internship field (3 credits)

Students still have time to apply, with a deadline of April 22. This program is a great choice for students who may prefer to study closer to home but have a culturally enriching experience.

Fulda Transnational Governance and Human Rights scholarship

Fulda University, a partner school of SUNY Cortland, is offering a generous scholarship for Fall 2022 study abroad. The scholarship will be awarded to an applicant for the <u>Transnational Governance and Human Rights</u> program, which runs from October 17, 2022, to mid-February 2023, in Fulda, Germany.

Scholarship Benefits: The scholarship will award a monthly stipend of €861 over the fourmonth period of the program, along with an international travel allowance. Eligibility: Student in the field of Sociology, Political Science, or International Studies. Application Deadline: <u>Apply for the Fall 2022 Fulda University Program</u> and complete the full program and scholarship application by April 15, 2022.

Program Spotlight Costa Rica: Universidad Veritas

Looking to study abroad in a perennial spring-like climate, spending your days in an average temperature of 72°F? Costa Rica might be for you! This warm and friendly country has more than 621 miles of shoreline, four kinds of tropical forests, beautiful beaches along both coasts, seventeen micro-climates, 855 species of birds, 221 animal species and 12,000 types of plants!

Universidad Veritas is an incredibly flexible program offering both 12 week (4 course) or 16 week (5 course) programs for both Fall and Spring semesters! If looking to study over the Summer, there are 4 or 5 week sessions available. There are a wide variety of courses taught in English as well as



immersive Spanish courses across multiple levels! Accommodation with host families will help you with language and understanding of the culture from locals.

Spend your free time enjoying the tropical landscape visiting waterfalls, beaches, volcanos and hiking the tropical forests, or you can explore the culture of the city. San Jose, the country's capital and home to Universidad Veritas, has a large number of excellent museums, restaurants, pubs and theaters. Originally founded in 1975 as a college of the "Universidad Autonoma de Centro America (UACA)" - the first private university in Costa Rica - Universidad Veritas is now an independent university, highly esteemed within the Latin American academic community. Located in the eastern part of San Jose, then minutes away from downtown, Universidad VERITAS has a student enrollment of nearly 1,500.
